There is no need to expose yourself to such atrocities, not after all you've been through already. The Baudelaire orphans disguise themselves as employees of the Hotel Denoument and find themselves pursued by the evil Count Olaf and others. *Heroes and Villains*, the seventh volume in Jon Scieszka's *Guys Read Library of Great Reading*, is chock-full of adventure featuring an array of characters—with and without capes. It might sound confusing, but that's love, and as the author -- me -- says, "It is not the nouns. The miracle is the adverbs, the way things are done." In my opinion a volcano automatically makes a story more interesting.
