***Transnational Ties* Aug 21 2020 Cities are key sites of the transnational ties that increasingly connect people, places, and projects across the globe. They provide opportunities and constraints within which transnational actors and networks**

operate and nodes linking wider social formations traverse national borders. growth has coincided with a substantial decline in turnout at the polls.
